What are Apprenticeships?

An apprenticeship is a way of gaining qualifications as you learn your new job. Normally a young person leaving education will be looking at the options available to them to move in to their chosen career. Some careers will need you to go to University as they require a degree, others may not require any qualifications at all. Most jobs fall in between, meaning that you will need to learn and gain qualifications as you go. An apprenticeship normally consists of 80% on the job training and 20% in education. You may go to college one day a week or in blocks, or maybe a training provider will visit you in the workplace.

Apprenticeships come in different levels and are open to all ages, not just young people. You may need entry qualifications to apply for an apprenticeship or do an entry test to ensure you can achieve the level of qualification the apprenticeship works to.

Levels of apprenticeship

	Level	Equivalent educational level
Intermediate	2	GCSE
Advanced	3	A level
Higher	4,5,6 and 7	Foundation degree and above
Degree	6 and 7	Bachelor's or master's degree

An apprenticeship is a real job, you will be paid a salary, have holiday leave and an employment contract the same as other employees. You will gain hands on experience, learn as you work and develop valuable skills.

What can I do if I don't have the entry requirements?

Sometimes a person may not have the required entry requirements for the apprenticeship they want to do. In this case a **Traineeship** may be the answer. A traineeship is a stepping stone towards an apprenticeships,

A traineeship is a course with work experience, offered by a college or training provider, which gets you ready for work or an apprenticeship. It can last from 6 weeks up to 1 year, though most traineeships last for less than 6 months. You can apply if you're eligible to work in England, unemployed and have little or no work experience and aged 16 to 24 and qualified up to and including Level 3 (equivalent to A Level). You are not paid on a traineeship.
